## 0.15\_BOBBLE STITCH

Dear friends, now that you are excellent knitters we can go crazy with little more complex fantasy stitches so here is the bobble stitch!

The bobble stitch is sometimes mixed up with his cousin, nut stitch, but it's much easier to realize, less rigid, although it gives the garment that three-dimensional movement of the typical nut.

The bobbles are ideal as a decoration for garments where you want to add volume: for example if you use the bobbles on the sleeves of a sweater, they will provide a fancy shape and texture.

Let's start to practice with the bobbles!

When you want to create a bobble proceed like this:

- Knit 4 stitches;
- Turn your work around and purl the previous 4 stitches;
- Turn the work around again and knit again the same 4 stitches;
- Repeat these two steps;
- On the right side of the work, knit the four stitches and continue knitting the remaining stitches of the row;
- Proceed in stockinette stitch until the next bobble.

Be sure to work tighter both the stitch before and the one after the bobble to make it pop out even more!

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
